- 5) List three (3) types of subjects often depicted by artists in either painting or sculpture. (3 pts)
- 6) List two (2) main building types in architecture. (2 pts)
- 7) List and define the first and most common method of architectural construction. (4 pts)
- 8) List two (2) materials relied upon in architecture. (2 pts)
- 9) List **and** define two (2) types of media used in painting. (6 pts)
- 10) List **and** define two (2) painting techniques. (6 pts)
- 11) Various media are used in sculpture. List one (1) **plastic** and one (1) **non-pliable** medium. (2 pts)
- 12) List **and** define two (2) sculpture techniques. What media are associated with each technique? (6 pts)
- 13) **Color** is an important **element of art**. List the hues that define the **primary** colors. For each primary color identify its **complementary** color. (6 pts)

- Accession/Object No.: Give the ID# for this work (2 pts)
- **Type of Art Form:** Is it a Major or Minor Art Form? What kind? (2 pts)
- **How does Figure 1 present itself?** Is it representational (realistic), abstract, or non-representational? Using the definitions of these terms, support your observation. (4 pts)
